Flood Relief Report

Incessant heavy rain (starting from 10th of August 2017) triggered flooding and landslides in Southern Nepal. As a consequence, twenty-one districts were affected with more than hundred deaths and more than eleven million people affected. Around 80% of the agricultural land and 35,000 houses were reported to have been inundated. In this time of calamity, people from within and outside Nepal extended support to the flood victims to ease out the situation that they were in.

Initiation taken by one of the board members of Kumudini to distribute relief packages in Saptari district was supported by some other board members, too. Hence, with limited budget, some food items and clothes were distributed there on the 18th of August 2017. During the visit to Saptari district, it was informed that some of the villages of Rautahat district had not been reached by the government and other supporting hands. Particularly, some underprivileged communities such as Musahar and Dalit communities had remained under the shadows and were difficult to be accessed by outsiders.

Hence at this time of need, three other organizations, namely Asha Nepal, Health Foundation Nepal and Angalo (an organization dedicated to senior citizens) joined hands with Kumudini. Items such as food, mosquito nets, blankets, mattresses, fortified super flour, soap, salt, bucket etc. were comprised the distribution packages.



Considering the security of the team as well as abiding by the directives of the government, Kumudini headed to those communities with support of INSEC representative, journalist and the Armed Police Force (AFP) in the district. The relief materials were distributed at APF's camp as well as by visiting the communities. A total of two hundred people comprising senior citizens, lactating and pregnant mothers and children from *Piprapakhariya* 8 and *Dumariya* 3 *Tilak tole*, Rautahat received relief materials on 30th August 2017.

The team observed that reached communities are behind in terms of awareness, education, access to basic services and living standard. In absence of information/knowledge on family planning, most of the families had many children with limited means for livelihood.
